



**54 years** male median age<sup>2</sup>


female median age<sup>2</sup> **52 years**

## COVID-19 RELATED MORTALITY


cumulative number of COVID-19 related deaths in Wirral


## EPIDEMIC CURVE

number of positive cases up to 11 September 2020 by Pillar 1 and Pillar 2 testing<sup>3</sup>


